


Ward Profile: Arnos Grove 2024



Arnos Grove ward is situated in the south-west of the Borough, bordered by the wards of New Southgate, Southgate and Palmers Green.

It is served by postal districts N11, N13 and N14.

Arnos Grove falls within the parliamentary constituency of Southgate and Wood Green.

Ward Profile: 2024




Population

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is estimated to be 8,102, having increased by 4.8% since 2011.

Age Profile

The ward has relatively high numbers of older residents when compared to the borough average, and proportionately fewer children and young adults. Women outnumber men in most age bands over 30 years of age, except 45-49 years and the 70-74 age group (see table bottom).






Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in managerial and professional occupations
- Household incomes are higher than the borough average, with low numbers of households in poverty.
- 3.5% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 14.5% of households in Universal Credit low numbers when compared with the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: Arnos Grove is relatively non-deprived. It contains no neighbourhood areas within the most deprived 50% of neighbourhoods in England.
- Proportions of households in fuel poverty are relatively low (8.7%, compared with 11.8% for the borough)
- Crime is relatively low
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 86% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- The proportion of people with disabilities is lower than the borough average
- Higher than average numbers of households are owner-occupiers
- High proportions of residents have higher level educational attainment, and relatively few adults have no formal qualifications



Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that – as at 2024 – households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income¹ of around £67,000 per annum, the highest ward average in the borough. It is also higher than the borough average, and higher than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, relatively high proportions of households in the ward have annual incomes in the higher income bands.



- 120 were in families of Absolute low income³.






Benefit Claims

Economically active people


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was higher than the borough average, at 77.4%.

Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.

Arnos Grove is within the least deprived 50% of all wards in England.5


The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived.


Ward level ⁶ deprivation deciles are shown in the map below. The wards with the highest relative deprivation are shaded in darker red.


Best-fit geographic analysis of government statistics⁷ estimate the number and percentage of households which are in fuel poverty as of 2022.




Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 521 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 2.8% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offences were vehicle offences and violence against the person.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents⁸ is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is a desirable aim, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.




Life Expectancy information at ward level is not yet available for the 2022 Ward boundary geographies. According to the 2021 Census, 995 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.










The 2021 Census data provides a view of the accommodation type by ward compared with the rest of the borough.




