


# Ward Profile: Bowes 2024



Bowes ward is situated in the south of the Borough, bordered by the wards of New Southgate, Upper Edmonton, Highfield, Haselbury and Palmers Green.

It is served by postal districts N11, N13, N18 and N22.

Bowes falls within the parliamentary constituencies of Southgate and Wood Green.

# Ward Profile: 2024




# **Population**

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is estimated to be 10,709, having increased by 7.9% since 2011.

# **Age Profile**

The ward has relatively high numbers of working age adults when compared to the borough average, and proportionately fewer children. Women outnumber men in all age bands over 30 years of age (see table bottom).





# Language


# **Socio-Economic Factors**

### Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in elementary, process and machine operating occupations and skilled trades
- Household incomes are roughly the same as the borough average, with lower than average numbers of households in poverty.
- 6.1% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 33% of households in Universal Credit similar to the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward is relatively deprived among the 30% most deprived wards in England.
- Proportions of households in fuel poverty are higher than average at 12.2%
- Crime is lower than average for the borough
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 84% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are private renters
- Levels of educational attainment are similar to the borough as a whole



#### Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that – as at 2024 – households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income<sup>1</sup> of around £52,000 per annum, above the borough average. It is below than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, the income profile of the ward largely matches that of the borough and regional averages.



- 345 were in families of Absolute low income<sup>3</sup>.






#### **Benefit Claims**

- As of April 2024, the unemployed Claimant Count<sup>4</sup> in the ward was 455
- At February 2023, 1,458 households (including working families) were claiming Universal Credit

#### **Economically active people**


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was higher than the borough average, at 73.4%. The proportion in employment was 65.6%.

#### **Deprivation score**

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government - measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.

Bowes is among the most deprived 30% of all wards in England.5


The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived.


Ward level<sup>6</sup> deprivation deciles are shown in the map below. The wards with the highest relative deprivation are shaded in darker red.






#### **Crime**

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 656 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 10.4% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offences were violence against the person and vehicle offences.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents<sup>8</sup> is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







#### Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.



According to the 2021 Census, 995 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.








