Re: Fireworks display at Enfield Town Park on Saturday 2nd November 2024

I would like to provide you with information regarding the proposed annual fireworks display at Enfield Town Park which will take place on **Saturday 2nd November 2024** between 4pm and 8pm.

We are working to deliver this year's exciting event and hope that it brings the community together to enjoy the forthcoming display.

The display will be a fully choreographed firework extravaganza lasting approximately 15 minutes scheduled for around 6.30pm. In addition to the display, there will be family activities, performance, and an array of food vendors. The event will have a capacity limit of 5,000 people and last entry will be at **6pm**.

Tickets are on sale now and can be purchased in advance of the event online at www.dugdaleartscentre.co.uk or at the box office at the Dugdale Arts Centre in Enfield Town.

Please note that digital tickets are not available for this event and all tickets are required to be collected from the Dugdale Arts Centre. When collecting your tickets you will need to bring with you your booking reference number and identification. Tickets need to be collected by 5:00pm Friday 1 November although we advise collecting before that date to avoid any queues or delays.

The construction and event schedules have been confirmed as follows:

During the event set up and take down, deliveries and collections will take place via Essex Road with security and traffic management in place to minimise any issues during this time. This will include some large vehicle movements. Traffic management remain in place throughout the event to maintain emergency access. Security will also be in the park overnight to oversee safety of equipment on site. Event vendors are scheduled to arrive from 11am on Saturday 2nd November and the park will be closed to the public from this time.

Event entrance for attendees will be via the two Cecil Road entrances – opposite Library Green and adjacent to Enfield Town Community Church. Attendees will not be able to gain entry via Essex Road.

There will be no residential access on the intersection of the New River loop as shown within the photos below between 4pm to 8pm for public safety during the fireworks display. Notices will be suitably placed in advance of the event.





There will also be traffic management officers deployed in Raleigh Road, Sydney Road, Uvedale Road, Walsingham Road, Park Crescent and Essex Road restricting access for residents only between 3pm and 8:15pm

If I want to attend how do I obtain tickets?

If you would like to attend the event you can purchase tickets via www.dugdaleartscentre.co.uk

What roads will be affected and when?

Pre event:

No Waiting Cones will be deployed at the entrance to the Park via Essex Road during the set up and breakdown of the event.

During the event:

Resident Access only into the following Roads Uvedale Road Walsingham Road Park Crescent Rayleigh Road Sydney Road Essex Road

What measures are being taken to stop people parking in the residential areas surrounding the park?

A traffic management company has been engaged to manage traffic surrounding the park. They will be stationed in all of the roads mentioned above in order to ensure that access is restricted to residents only. They will be present between 3pm and 8:15pm on Saturday 2^{ND} November. The Council's Parking Enforcement Team have been notified of the event and will be present in the area.

Who do I contact if a vehicle is blocking my access to my home/business?

What if road closures affect access to my property?

Residents will still be permitted access into the side roads. Road marshals will ensure free access to residents and residents are recommended to carry a copy of this letter, use the password provided OR proof of address when entering your road by car.

Will the event affect public transport?

Although tube and bus services will be busier than usual, TfL envisions a normal service throughout the weekend.

Is there a cleansing operation in place for areas outside of the park?

There is a cleansing operation for areas both inside and outside of the park. Enfield Council's Staff will provide extra cleansing of the surrounding areas during and immediately after the event.

Who should I contact if I want to report issues to do with litter or street cleansing as a result of the event?

Will I be able to use the rest of the park and if so, will it be safe?

The Park will be closed from 11:00am on Saturday 2nd November and will reopen as per normal park opening times on Sunday 3rd November. There will still be some of the event infrastructure leaving the site on Monday 4th November and recommend members of public to be cautious of any moving vehicles.

What is being done to address anti-social behaviour?

Entry and exit from the event will be tightly controlled by an independent security company. Access to the event is via Cecil Road entrance and the gate beside Enfield Community Church and way finders will redirect people to use the correct entrance.

The event will **not** include the sale of alcohol and attendees are not allowed to bring any liquids into the event.

All security staff are SIA-accredited (the industry standard) and well-trained in dealing with crime and disorder issues. Any member of the public causing a nuisance will be required to leave the site and a note of this made in our records.

In addition, the Police are aware of this event and will intermittently be in attendance.
