


# Ward Profile: Cockfosters 2024



Cockfosters is situated in the north west of the Borough, bordered by the wards of Oakwood, Southgate and Ridgeway

It is covered by postal districts of N14 and EN4.

The ward falls within the parliamentary constituency of Southgate and Wood Green.

## Ward Profile: 2024

This profile is intended to provide a guide to the demography, social and economic data and Council facilities in the ward.

Not all data is available at ward level for the 2022 ward boundaries. Some statistics appearing in this document have been aggregated from smaller statistical geographies on a 'best fit' basis.




# **Population**

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is estimated to be 10,688. The population has increased by 8.2% since 2011.

## **Age Profile**

The ward has relatively low numbers of children and young adults when compared to the borough average, and proportionately more older adults. Women outnumber men in most age bands over 25 years of age (see table bottom).






## **Socio-Economic Factors**

#### Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in managerial and professional occupations.
- Household incomes are higher than the borough average, with relatively low numbers of households in poverty.
- 2.1% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 17.5% of households in Universal Credit lower than the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has relatively low deprivation levels in most areas, however it is among the 50% most deprived wards in England.
- Proportion of households in fuel poverty is lower than average 9.2%
- · Crime is relatively low.
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 84% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are owner-occupiers.
- Levels of educational attainment are higher than the borough as a whole



#### Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that, as at 2024, households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income<sup>1</sup> of around £60,000 per annum, which is above the borough average. It is also higher than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, higher than average proportions of households in the ward are in the higher income bands.



- 205 were in families of Absolute low income<sup>3</sup>.






#### **Benefit Claims**

#### **Economically active people**


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was higher than the borough average, at 74.0%. The proportion in employment was 70.1%.

#### **Deprivation score**

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


Cockfosters is among the most deprived 50% of all wards in England.5

The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.








#### **Crime**

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 619 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 4.8% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offence categories were Vehicle offences and Violence against the person
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents<sup>8</sup> is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







#### Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.



According to the 2021 Census, 995 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.










