


Ward Profile: Ponders End 2024




Population

The ward has higher than average proportions of school-aged children and young adults, and relatively fewer older residents. The split between male and female residents by age band is in the chart (bottom).






Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in caring, leisure, customer service and elementary occupations.
- Household incomes are lower than the borough average, with relatively high numbers of households in poverty.
- 6.9% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 49% of households on Universal Credit higher than the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has high deprivation levels it is among the 10% most deprived wards in England.
- The proportion of households in fuel poverty is higher than the borough average, at 15%
- Crime levels are higher than the borough average
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 83% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are renters in both private and social rented sectors.
- Levels of educational attainment are lower than that of the borough population in general.



Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that, as at 2024, households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income¹ of around £42,000 per annum, which is below the borough average. It is also lower than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, higher than average proportions of households in the ward are in the lower income bands.








Benefit Claims

Economically active people


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was lower than the borough average, at 63.9%. The proportion in employment was 57.3%.

Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


Ponders End is among the most deprived 10% of all wards in England.5

The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.










Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 1754 notifiable offences in the ward a rise of 0.7% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offence categories were Violence Against the Person and Theft.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents⁸ is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



According to the 2021 Census, 1,742 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.












