


Ward Profile: Edmonton Green 2024




Population

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is estimated to be 16,728 – a total that has not changed significantly in the past decade.

Age Profile

The ward has relatively high numbers of children and young adults when compared to the borough average, and proportionately fewer older adults. Women outnumber men in most age bands over 10 years of age (see table bottom).






Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in elementary occupations.
- Household incomes are lower than the borough average, with relatively high numbers of households in poverty.
- 10.3% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 49% of households in Universal Credit higher than the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has very high relative deprivation levels and it is among the 10% most deprived wards in England.
- Proportion of households in fuel poverty is higher than average 13.8%
- Crime is relatively high.
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 81% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are renters in both the private and social rented sectors.
- Levels of educational attainment are lower than the borough as a whole



Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that, as at 2024, households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income¹ of around £35,000 per annum, which is below the borough average. It is lower than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, higher than average proportions of households in the ward are in the lower income bands .



- 1,074 were in families of Absolute low income³.






Benefit Claims

Economically active people


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was lower than the borough average, at 62.0%. The proportion in employment was 55.4%.

Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


Edmonton Green is the most deprived ward in Enfield, and among the most deprived 10% of all wards in England.⁵

The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.








Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 2,650 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 6% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offence categories were Violence against the person and Theft.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators








Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. 

According to the 2021 Census, 2,534 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.







The 2021 (Census) profile of the households in the ward by housing tenure (sector) is as shown below, compared with borough averages.






