


# Ward Profile: Ridgeway 2024



Ridgeway is situated in the north west of the borough, and is bordered by Cockfosters, Oakwood, Grange Park, Town and Whitewebbs. At eleven square kilometres, it is the largest ward by area.

It is served by the postal districts of EN2, EN4 and EN6.

The ward falls within the parliamentary constituency of Enfield North.

# Ward Profile: 2024

This profile is intended to provide a guide to the demography, social and economic data and Council facilities in the ward.

Not all data is available at ward level for the 2022 ward boundaries. Some statistics appearing in this document have been aggregated from smaller statistical geographies on a 'best fit' basis.




# **Population**

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is thought to be 12,500, having increased by 8.3% since 2011.

The ward has higher than average proportions people aged 55 and over, and relatively fewer school-aged children and young adults. The split between male and female residents by age band is in the chart (bottom).






# **Socio-Economic Factors**

#### Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in managerial and professional occupations.
- Household incomes are higher than the borough average, with relatively low numbers of households in poverty.
- 3.8% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 16.9% of households on Universal Credit lower than the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has a mixture of low and high deprivation levels it is among the 50% most deprived wards in England.
- The proportion of households in fuel poverty is lower than the borough average at 6.8%
- · Crime levels are relatively low.
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 85% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are owner-occupiers
- Levels of educational attainment are higher than that of the borough population in general.



#### Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that, as at 2024, households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income<sup>1</sup> of around £55,500 per annum, which is above the borough average. It is also higher than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, slightly higher than average proportions of households in the ward are in the higher income bands.



- 157 were in families of Absolute low income<sup>3</sup>.






#### **Benefit Claims**

#### **Economically active people**


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was higher than the borough average, at 77.7%. The proportion in employment was 73.8%.

#### **Deprivation score**

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


Ridgeway is among the most deprived 50% of all wards in England, despite most of its neighbourhood areas being relatively non-deprived.<sup>5</sup>

The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.


Ward level <sup>6</sup> deprivation deciles are shown in the map below. The wards with the highest relative deprivation are shaded in darker red.






# **Crime**

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 885 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 8.4% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offence categories were Violence Against the Person and Vehicle Offences.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents<sup>8</sup> is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







## Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.










The 2021 Census data provides a view of the accommodation type by ward compared with the rest of the borough.




