


Ward Profile: Enfield Lock 2024



Enfield Lock is situated in the north east of the Borough, bordered by the wards of Bullsmoor, Carterhatch and Brimsdown.

It is covered by postal districts of EN3, plus small sections of EN8 and EN9.

The ward falls within the parliamentary constituency of Enfield North.

Ward Profile: 2024

This profile is intended to provide a guide to the demography, social and economic data and Council facilities in the ward.

Not all data is available at ward level for the 2022 ward boundaries. Some statistics appearing in this document have been aggregated from smaller statistical geographies on a 'best fit' basis.

The profile has been collated using the most up to date local-level data relating to 2023-24 as far as possible. A variety of statistical sources have been used in its compilation.




Population

Based on the 2022 ONS mid-year estimate, the ward population is estimated to be 17,709. The population has increased by 7.5% since 2011.

Age Profile

The ward has relatively high numbers of children and young adults when compared to the borough average, and proportionately fewer older adults. Female residents outnumber males in all age bands over 15 years of age (see table bottom).






Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has relatively high numbers of adults in elementary occupations.
- Household incomes are lower than the borough average, with relatively high numbers of households in poverty.
- 7.1% of working age adults are on unemployment benefits and 41% of households in Universal Credit higher than the borough averages
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has high relative deprivation levels, and it is among the 20% most deprived wards in England.
- Proportions of households in fuel poverty are higher than average at 12.4%.
- Crime levels are slightly lower than the borough average.
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 83% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are renters in both the private and social rented sectors.
- Levels of educational attainment are lower than in the borough as a whole.



Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that, as at 2024, households in the ward have an average (median) gross household income¹ of around £42,500 per annum, which is below the borough average. It is also lower than the average for the London area.

The percentage of households with an annual income below £25,000 is shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the distribution of annual household incomes in the ward by £20,000 bands, with comparator areas.

As can be seen, higher than average proportions of households in the ward are in the lower income bands .



- 774 were in families of Absolute low income³.






Benefit Claims

- As of April 2024, the unemployed claimant count⁴ in the ward was 830.
- At February 2024, 2,910 households (including working families) were claiming Universal Credit

Economically active people


In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was lower than the borough average, at 66.8%. The proportion in employment was 60.3%.

Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


Enfield Lock is the ninth most deprived ward in Enfield, and among the most deprived 20% of all wards in England.⁵

The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.




5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.


Ward level ⁶ deprivation deciles are shown in the map below. The wards with the highest relative deprivation are shaded in darker red.






Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2023 to March 2024 indicate that:

- There were 1,543 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 2% on the previous year.
- The most numerous offence categories were Violence Against the Person and Vehicle Offences.
- The crime rate per 1,000 residents⁸ is shown in the chart below right, with borough and regional comparators







Health


The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.




Life Expectancy information at ward level is not yet available for the 2022 Ward boundary geographies. However, data are available at Middle Layer Super Output Area level - another census geography with boundaries that do not match those of wards. According to the 2021 Census, 2,526 residents had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010). The proportions by age band are shown below.







The 2021 (Census) profile of the households in the ward by housing tenure (sector) is as shown below, compared with borough averages.




The 2021 Census data provides a view of the accommodation type by ward compared with the rest of the borough.




