TRAINING ON THE P.A.C.E APPROACH

PACE IS A RECOGNISED, EFFECTIVE TRAUMA INFORMED APPROACH TO ENGAGING AND WORKING WITH SOME OF OUR MOST DYSREGULATED CHILDREN WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED SIGNIFICANT TRAUMA TO SUPPORT POSITIVE OUTCOMES.

A SESSION EXPLORING HOW TO USE TRAUMA INFORMED PRACTICE TO ENGAGE CHILDREN WITH A SOCIAL WORKER I.E. LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN, CHILDREN WITH A CIN PLAN, CHILDREN WITH A CP PLAN, AND PREVIOUSLY LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN (THOSE WHO HAVE LEFT CARE WITH AN ADOPTION ORDER, SPECIAL GUARDIANSHIP ORDER OR CHILD ARRANGEMENT ORDER) AND GET THE BEST FROM THEM.

PACE IS A WAY OF THINKING, FEELING, COMMUNICATING AND BEHAVING THAT AIMS TO MAKE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE FEEL SAFE. IT IS PARTICULARLY EFFECTIVE IN MEETING THE NEEDS OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED TRAUMA.
