


Ward Profile: Upper Edmonton 2023



Upper Edmonton is situated in the south-east of the borough, and bordered by Bowes, Highfield, Haselbury and Edmonton Green.

It is served by the postal district of N18.

The ward falls within the parliamentary constituency of Edmonton.

Ward Profile: 2023

This profile is intended to provide a guide to the demography, social and economic data and Council facilities in the ward.

At time of writing, not all data is available at ward level for the new ward boundaries (effective from 2022). Some statistics appearing in this document have been aggregated from smaller statistical geographies on a 'best fit' basis.

The profile has been collated using the most up to date local-level data relating to 2022/23 as far as possible. A variety of statistical sources have been used in its compilation.




Population

Based on the <u>2021 Census</u>, the ward population is estimated to be 16,726.¹ The population increased by 11.6% from 2011 to 2021.

Age Profile

The age profile of the ward reveals higher than average proportions of school aged children and young adults (aged under 35), and relatively few older residents. The split between male and female residents by age band is in the chart (bottom).






¹ Census 2021 population totals vary in accordance with geographies and characteristics being measured: eg the sum of allage ward populations do not necessarily match the published borough total, and the sum of age band totals do not necessarily match ward and borough totals. This has occurred owing to changes in statistical suppression practices used by the ONS in order to release Census data more quickly. Differences are small and have very little effect upon calculations of proportions.

Language


Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has higher than average proportions of adults in caring, customer service, leisure and elementary occupations.
- Household incomes are below the borough average, with higher than average proportions of households in poverty.
- 8.2% of adults are on unemployment benefits and 38.9% of households receive Universal Credit higher levels than the borough averages for both
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has high deprivation levels it is among the 10% most deprived wards in England.
- The proportions of households in fuel poverty is above the borough average (18.4%, compared with 13.8% for the borough)
- · Crime levels are relatively high.
- Health: at the 2021 Census, 83% of residents reported Very Good or Good health
- Higher than average numbers of households are renters in both the private and the social rented sectors
- Levels of educational attainment are lower than those of the borough population in general.

Socio-economic classification

Occupational groups are taken from the 2021 Census. The table below indicates the occupational profile of the ward, compared with the borough in general.



Low Income Households


Data from CACI Ltd indicate that – as at 2023 – households in the ward have an average (median) household income of around £35,000 per annum, which is below the borough and London region averages.

- 24.2% of households have a household income of less than £20,000 per annum the borough average is 17.3%
- 14.5% of households have an income below £15,000 per annum the borough average is 10%

Statistics from the Department for Work and Pensions indicate that, in 2022:

- 1195 children² in the ward (23.0% of the total) were living in families with Relative low income, and
- 934 (18.0%) were in families of Absolute low income³.

The proportions of children in poverty compared with local, regional and national averages are shown in the chart below.



Benefit Claims

- As of April 2023, the unemployed claimant count⁴ in the ward was 905, representing 8.2% of the local working-age population (the borough average was 6%)
- At February 2023, 2470 households (including working families) were claiming Universal Credit (38.9% of all households in the ward). This compares with a borough average of 29.0% on Universal Credit.

Economically active people

In 2021, the estimated proportion of people aged 16-64 who were in work or looking for work (the economically active) was lower than the borough average, at 64.1%. The proportion in employment was 57.2%.

Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government⁵ measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.

Upper Edmonton is among the most deprived 10% of all wards in England.6

² Aged up to 19 years (includes 16-19 year-olds who are in training or non-advanced education – ie categories for which Child Benefit would be payable assuming no other disqualifying factors)


³ Relative low income: equivalised household income is less than 60% of the UK median for that year. Absolute low income: equivalised household income is less than 60% of the UK median for the period 2010-2011.

⁴ The 'narrow' measure of unemployment: the number of people receiving either Job Seekers' Allowance, or unemployed claimants of Universal Credit who are required to seek work.



The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.



5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.




Fuel Poverty


Best-fit geographic analysis of government statistics⁷ reveal that, as at 2021, 18.4% of households in the ward were in fuel poverty. This proportion was higher than the borough, regional and national averages (13.8%, 11.9% and 13.1% respectively).

Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period April 2022 to March 2023 indicate that:


- There were 2,727 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 6.2% on the previous year.
- The crime rate was 163.0 offences per 1,000 population higher than the borough and regional averages.
- The most numerous offence categories were Violence Against the Person and Theft.






Health

The 2021 Census asks residents to describe their general health. The chart below illustrates the response:



Ageing in a state of good health is obviously a desirable aim where possible, and the Census provides a snapshot of the health of people in different age groups. A separate analysis divides the population into those whose health is broadly 'Good' and those for whom is it 'Not Good'. The chart below details the percentage of under 65s and over 65s who describe their health as Good.



Life Expectancy information at ward level is not yet available for the 2022 Ward boundary geographies. However, data are available at Middle Layer Super Output Area level - another census geography with boundaries that do not match those of wards. These are mapped below: the darkest shaded areas have the highest life expectancy at birth.





The 2021 (Census) profile of the households in the ward by housing tenure (sector) is as shown below, compared with borough averages.




The 2021 Census data provides a view of the accommodation type by ward compared with the rest of the borough.




