- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Enfield (the Council) propose to make the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. *) Order 202* and The Enfield (Parking Places) (Pay and Display) (No. *) Traffic Order 202*, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- **2.** The general effect of the Order would be to:
 - (a) Extend the existing "at any time" waiting restrictions on the north-west side of Suez Road between its southern extremity and a point 220 metres north of the northern kerbline of the east to west arm of Aden Road;
 - (b) Introduce a 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. Mon Sat parking restriction on the north-west side of Suez Road between a point 220 metres north of the northern kerb-line of the east to west arm of Aden Road and a point 108 metres north of the southern wall of No.17 Suez Road;
 - (c) Upgrade the existing single yellow line restriction on the southern kerb-line of the access road leading to No.17 Suez Road to "at any time" restrictions;
 - (d) Extend the existing "at any time" waiting restrictions on the south-east side of Suez Road between its southern extremity and a point 68 metres north of the northern kerbline of the east to west arm of Aden Road;
 - (e) Introduce a 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. Mon Sat parking restriction on the south-east of Suez Road between a point 68 metres north of the northern kerb-line of the east to west arm of Aden Road and a point 32 metres north of that point; and
 - (f) Introduce permanent "at any time" waiting restrictions on the south-east side of Suez Road from a point 100 metres north of the northern kerb-line of the east to west arm of Aden Road and its northern junction with Mollison Avenue.

Statement of Reasons

Suez Road, EN3

Overview: Enfield Council is aware of problematic parking habits having developed on Suez Road, including the long-stay parking of heavy goods vehicles. This is reported to hinder access for other large vehicles into private service yards. Parking controls along the full length of the road between Aden Road and Dundee Way are proposed, covering both the eastern and western kerbside. Being only 6.5 metres in width, and needing to accommodate large commercial vehicles heading north and south, the view of the Council is that any retained parking positions should be on one side of the road only in any given section. In this street the Council favours an approach where every section of kerbside has some form of parking control to reduce the risk of unhelpful parking activity simply relocating from one unsuitable position to another.

Southern Section: The most southerly 150 metre section of the road features two points where the alignment of the road kinks. It is deemed prudent to extend the existing double yellow lines to cover all this section on both sides of the road. This will ensure large vehicles have sufficient road space to negotiate the twisting sections and will avoid the issue of drivers proceeding up the middle portion of the road, due to parked cars on their inside, and thus heading towards oncoming drivers occupying the same portion of the road where mutual sightlines are restricted by the road alignment.

Northern Section – Eastern Side: The straight, northerly section of the road is around 300 metres long and matches the relatively narrow dimensions of the southern section at around 6.5 metres wide. Accordingly allowing parking on one side only is favoured. The western side benefits from a footway adjacent to the kerbside while the whole of the eastern kerb is bordered by a green area, much of which is hedgerow. With the western side offering better amenity for those seeking to enter or emerge from vehicles parked at the kerbside, it is the western side where some retained parking provision is proposed and the opposing kerb-line along which continuous double yellow lines are proposed, replacing the length that is presently either unmarked or marked with a single yellow line.

Northern Section – Western Side: On the western side of this northern section, double yellow lines are proposed at the most southerly 60 metres length north of the bend in the road. This will offer access protection for large vehicles to the two commercial units in this section. A third commercial access point on the western side is sited at the northern end of the section. The double yellow lines to the north of this access point are to be retained. The approximately 10 metre length of single yellow line to the south of the access point is to be upgraded to double yellow line to match the same level of protection applying to the other access points. South of the single yellow line is an historic section of parking bay, around 45 metres in length. Hitherto this has had time limited controls with the effect of allowing free parking for up to one hour, with no return within one hour, operating Monday to Friday 8am to 6.30pm; most likely intended to serve as customer parking for the adjacent premises. It is proposed to keep the extent of the bay and the operational period the same but replace the

time limited form of control with paid parking, which is less challenging to enforce and thus provides a greater deterrent against unwanted long-stay parking activity. Immediately south of the parking bays is an historic bus stand position. An officer at TfL has advised that this facility is still in use on an occasional basis to accommodate diverted services or for drivers needing to delay before continuing on their route to avoid running ahead of the timetable. It is proposed that a 27 metres long bus stand marking is provided to accompany the existing bus stop post in the footway and thus ensure the position is clear of other vehicles when needed for the bus service. Between the proposed new bus stand and the limit of the double yellow line at the access point to the south is the remaining stretch of kerbside, a section around 85 metres in length. The proposals intend that this section be retained as all-purpose communal daytime parking for any driver having cause to leave a vehicle in Suez Road during normal business hours. In order to prevent this section of kerbside being mis-used for overnight HGV parking or becoming dominated by vehicles left there in long term storage, a single yellow line is proposed with a one hour daily parking control applying from 6pm to 7pm. This form of control should allow effective enforcement against unwanted overnight parking but offer minimal hindrance to usage of the kerbside for business hours parking activity.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Enfield (Parking Places) (Pay and Display) (No. **) Order 20** and shall come into operation on ** ******* 20**.

Interpretation

- 2. (1) In this Order, "the Order of 2007" means the Enfield (Parking Places) (Pay and Display) (Various Roads) (Special Parking Area) (No. 1) Order 2007(b);
- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

(3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2007 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendment to the Order of 2007

3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2007 shall have effect as though there were added to Schedule 8 to that Order the schedule set out in Schedule to this order.

Designation of parking place and application of the Order of 2007 thereto

- 4. (1) The area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2 metres is designated as a parking place.
- (2) The provisions of the Order of 2007 (other than Articles 3, 4 and 20) shall apply to the area designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to the area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 8, Part I to the Order of 2007 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

5. The Council shall:

- (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of the parking place designated by this Order;
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of the parking place designated by this Order traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 5, 7 and 9 of the Order of 2007 or as amended;
- (c) place and maintain traffic signs in or in the vicinity of each parking place indicating:
 - i. that the parking place may be used by vehicles in respect of which payment of the parking charge is made using the electronic payment system; and
 - ii. the location identification number of the parking place or part thereof;
- (d) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

Revoked Orders

6. Without Prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, The Enfield (Free Parking Place) (Various Roads) (Special Parking Area) (No. 1) Order 1998 is hereby revoked.
