
Hi,

I reside at 18 Chase Court Gardens EN28DH and I am reaching out to you as a concerned citizen and resident of the borough of Enfield.

It is extremely worrying to read about the Council's plans to destroy what little remains of the greenbelt which is essential for the physical and mental health of our borough and City.

On one hand the government talks about the importance of the environment and on the other we have local councils who want to destroy what ever little greenspace is available.

As a citizen I humbly request you to please refrain from proceeding with the draft local plan that seeks to create housing across areas such as Vicarage Farm, Crews Hill and Hadley Wood.

The points on the draft plan that **I am particularly concerned and worried about and therefore oppose are:**

- 3,000 new houses at a 'deeply green' 'sustainable urban extension' referred to as 'Chase Park' (also known as Vicarage Farm) (Policy SP PL 10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11);
- 3,000 new houses in a 'sustainable settlement' at Crews Hill with the potential for longer term expansion up to 7,500 new homes right up to the M25. (Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10);
- 160 homes in Green Belt countryside at Hadley Wood (SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364);
- 11 hectares of new industrial and storage and distribution use at what is currently agricultural land east of Junction 24 of the M25 at part of new Cottages and Holly Hill Farm within Enfield Chase (SA54, page 374);
- Tall buildings in the town centre (see pages 156-60, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping centre page 321)

The points mentioned above that really focus on destroying the green belt along with the decision to allocate White Webbs land to the Spurs football team is nothing but a long and short term ecological and environmental disaster.

I have lived in multiple countries around the world and the green belt is a true asset of London and our borough as well. We have to remember that once it is destroyed, it is gone forever. Please prevent this destruction as this is not something that most citizens voted for.

I sincerely hope that common sense prevails and our leaders work for the greater good of the people of Enfield and the green belt.
