I have become aware of the green belt plans to destroy the beautiful countryside in Enfield and surround, and all that it offers to residents and visitors, and vehemently object and refute any such policies stated below:

SP PL10, pages 80-87 and Figure 3.11; Policy SP PL9 pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10; Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364; Policy SA54, page 374; Policy SA62 page 372; and Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 - all of which propose the destruction of Green Belt for housing and other purposes.

It is abhorrent that this land could be considered worthless and suitable for construction purposes, this is ancient land belonging to Enfield Chase and is part of unique heritage to Enfield as a County.
