Dear Sir

I write to strongly object to some of the plans as outlined in the Enfield growth strategy in plan for over the next two decades as detailed below;

**[Policy SP PL 10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11](#)**

- 3,000 new houses at a 'deeply green' 'sustainable urban extension' referred to as 'Chase Park' (also known as Vicarage Farm) on the open Green Belt countryside next to Trent Park either side of the A110 (Enfield Road) between Oakwood and Enfield town. **This will obliterate the entire greenery and existing ecosystem but also create massive stress on existing local facilities. There is an ongoing significant push to address climate emergency on a massive scale around the world and it would appear, regrettably, Enfield Council seems to be going the opposite direction.**
- 3,000 new houses in a 'sustainable settlement' at Crews Hill with the potential for longer term expansion up to 7,500 new homes right up to the M25. (**[Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10](#)**);
- 160 homes in Green Belt countryside at Hadley Wood (**[SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364](#)**);
- 11 hectares of new industrial and storage and distribution use at what is currently agricultural land east of Junction 24 of the M25 at part of new Cottages and Holly Hill Farm within Enfield Chase (**[SA54, page 374](#)**);

We know there is a housing issue in the country, but it is illogical and nonsensical to wipe out chunks of greenery which Enfield is known for just to build houses. This is counter productive to the environment and people's mental wellbeing. There is already massive amount of stress being handed to us by the Council by giving outrageous planning consents to build ridiculous high rises which creates extraordinary level of people density, traffic and stress amongst resident.

When trying to solve a problem, one should think laterally to ensure all possible scenarios are covered. That is Enfield Council's weakness. They are very insular and blinkered and everytime they think they've solve a problem, it gives rises to many other problems.

Take simply road traffic arrangements , from yellow boxes to road network rearrangements is just a mess.

Please stop this destruction of the greenbelt and my local area.
