I am writing in relation to the consultation regarding the green belt.

I lived in Hadley Wood growing up and my parents still live there. We wanted to buy a home there to be near my parents but also we value the green spaces. All my family very much object to the proposed site allocation which would allow the development of 160 homes on the green belt land.

There are numerous issues which lead to my objections. Firstly, as a mother I'm concerned that the site will not be sustainable due to insufficient services. It has poor public transport links, there will be an over reliance on cars, due to limited local amenities ie no local GP, post office, secondary school and only a small primary school.

I'm doubtful that 160 new homes warrant investment needed to increase the above mentioned provisions. Where would the extra school/other amenities go?

Secondly, the site is surrounded by conservation areas and grade ll listed buildings, it would not be possible to build on the site without negatively impacting the character and appearance of these assets.

Lastly, I'm very concerned about the increased flood risk. My parents garage was recently flooded. The infrastructure is just not good/safe enough.
