I have lived in Hadley Wood for all my life and was fortunate to attend the local primary school. I love the area with its wide green streets and expansive open spaces. During lockdown I started to walk all the streets including Waggon road and Barnet Road and its from there that you can appreciate the beautiful views across the landscape across Hertsmere, Barnet and Enfield which culminates into this field. It is therefore not surprising that Herts County Council have sought to protect this valuable landscape within the Hormbeam Hills South Area of Special Character, which Enfield Council endorsed. It's not clear to me why the council have sought to now ignore this and remove the land from the green belt and allocate it for development. The meadow forms an important part of Hadley Wood segregating the Borough from London Borough of Barnet and helps to protect the special character of the area. The Council have declared a climate change emergency, but their action in seeking to promote development on a site that would be highly reliant on car traffic goes completely against this policy.

I therefore object to the proposed release of this meadow in Hadley Wood from the green belt and its draft allocation for housing development on the following grounds.

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Can you please therefore remove this proposed site allocation from the next edition of the Local Plan and retain the green belt status.
