I am surprised and worried by the amount of traffic over recent years and the parking difficulties with cars becoming bigger and bigger and many more of them. Modern developments over the years in Kingwell Road, Claremont Road and Courtleigh Avenue have been thoughtfully fitted in amidst the existing attractive older properties and the very popular oversubscribed school will not be able to take more children so what will happen to those in this suggested new development?
