I feel annoyed but sad that I am having to write this email with my objection to the plans that I have viewed, over and over again.

Policy SP PL9 - Crews Hill, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10;
Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364;
Policy SA54 - Other sites outside the placemaking areas, page 374;
Policy SA62 page 383
SP CL4 pages 277-279

I have lived in Enfield for 53 years. The character of Enfield's green belt has been spoken about for as long as I remember. The fabulous and well known Green Belt is a rare and valuable landscape asset and its loss would be catastrophic not only to the Green Belt, the character of the borough but personally to me and my family, who use the areas in Chase Park to run and walk. The above sites are part of history in Enfield Chase, which is unique in the Southeast, please don't change this, it will be regretted and change the heritage of Enfield, which I so love.

I am also objecting to the tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321 which propose areas for and the acceptable height of tall buildings which, in many cases would ruin the landscape. I remember the tall flats being removed in Edmonton so why would we go back to tall buildings again. Low rise, creates better lighting and landscape.

I wish I could go on giving all my reasons to all these proposals that I have read but I have to highlight my concerns of losing the known landscape of Enfield, the Crew Hill garden centre that people I've met all around the country know of, the endless road repairs that Enfield council currently undertake due to the volume of traffic, which would only increase with the volume of road users. The already packed trains and public transport. The wonderful wildlife that we see, would diminish.

For the life of me, I really cannot justify any value to the area what so ever and just the huge sadness of the loss of what Enfield does have and the history that goes with it.
