I am an Enfield Council resident and have enjoyed these spaces over the last 40+ years, it would be a huge shame to see the deterioration of these green local spaces. I feel very strongly that the Green Belt protects the special character of Hadley Wood and therefore object to the proposed sit allocation, which would allow the development of 160 homes on Green Belt land.

The main reasons for objection are:

- 1. Wrong location for sustainable development. There are poor local connections and lac of amenities in the Green Belt area and without further development of nearby infrastructure this will caused further issues to local residents and commuters. There is no local GP or post office etc and no local employment opportunities.
- 2. Brownfield sites have not been prioritised before this Green Belt area. There are many other more suitable locations that wouldn't impose of Green Belt areas.
- 3. This plan will destroy the current Green Belt beauty which should be protected. Enfield Council refers to the area as "a special area of landscape character which is a major asset for the borough. It is of both landscape and historic significance". "The Green Belt boundary should be retained and protected, and future development and land use changes resisted". It is very unclear as to why this decision could be accepted and this area ruined.
- 4. The site is surrounded by Grade II Listed buildings and Conservation Areas. Hadley Wood Conservation Area, the Monken Hadley Conservation Area & Grade II listed buildings on Camlet. This build would adversely affect the setting, appearance and character of the area which is recognised by Enfield Council.
