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To whom it may concern,

as a long-standing resident of Enfield Highlands ward, having lived in the borough for over forty years, I write to you to strongly object to Enfield Council's draft local plan, in particular the following policies:

1. SP PL10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11; Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10; Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364; Policy SA54, page 374; and Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 – all of which propose the dedesignation of Green Belt for housing and other purposes.

These sites are unique as they form a part of historic Enfield Chase. This landscape should not be destroyed as it is all an important historic and natural part of the Green Belt and the permanent loss of this land would cause great detriment to the character of Enfield as a green and beautiful borough.

The building of housing on this land would cause the loss of important wildlife, not to mention the additional pollution from the increase of vehicles that will be on the roads.

2. I also object to Policies SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 because they transfer part of Whitewebbs Park, a public amenity, into private management. I reject the Council's analysis that Whitewebbs Golf Course was losing money and call for its reinstatement.

3. I am also objecting to Policy SA52 page 372, which would remove part of Rammey Marsh, a wildlife area and public amenity, from the Green Belt.

4. I am also objecting to the tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321 which propose areas for and the acceptable height of tall buildings which, in many cases would mar the landscape and are unnecessary because other lower-rise building forms could provide the same accommodation, as stated in the policy.

I urge the council to seriously rethink these plans as they are a detriment to the beautiful and unique character of Enfield borough which should be preserved for future generations to enjoy.
