
Please accept this email as my view and objection against any new housing to be built along the A110 in relation to the below policy.

3,000 new houses at a 'deeply green' 'sustainable urban extension' referred to as 'Chase Park' (also known as Vicarage Farm) on the open Green Belt countryside next to Trent Park either side of the A110 (Enfield Road) between Oakwood and Enfield town ([Policy SP PL 10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11](#));

I am against any building upon our precious green belt land anywhere but more so Vicarage Farm as this area is where I was brought up and my parents still live. There are numerous schools in the area whose pupils benefit from having access to this land. Local families and the elderly who use the path at Merryhills Way as part of their daily exercise and a pollution free way of accessing the local shops of Oakwood.
