I would like to object to the draft Local Plan.

I am writing to object to the following Policies:

Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279

The above policies aim for housing on green areas. My main objection is that if the above policies are considered as a whole; then this is a massive development and it will be detrimental to local life. They will cause harm to the Green Belt and the detrimental results of these proposed developments will be irreversible.

Enfield Borough is an outer suburb. Enfield does not share Central London characteristics. Therefore, the above developments will turn Enfild from an outer pleasant suburb town to a congested inner suburb without having enough green areas for its local residents as well as natural life itself.

The gigantic tall buildings are not characteristic of Enfield. They will create overpopulated areas in Enfield. They will put disturbing strains on local schools, GPs, public and road transport, parking areas, and green areas. The health, transport and education organisations are already at their limits to provide their crucial services. I believe there is no additional capacity to put extra weight on these services by erecting tall buildings to accommodate more people for short term gains at the cost of preserving main public services in the long term.
