I am writing to object to the following Policies: SP PL10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11; Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10; Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364; Policy SA54, page 374; and Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 — all of which propose the destruction of Green Belt for housing and other purposes.

I also object to Policies SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 because they transfer part of Whitewebbs Park, a public amenity, into private management. I reject the Council's analysis that Whitewebbs Golf Course was losing money and call for its reinstatement. 3. Although sadly, I see that this council has already agreed a lease with THFC.

I am also objecting to Policy SA52 page 372, which would remove part of Rammey Marsh, a wildlife area and public amenity, from the Green Belt.

I am also objecting to the tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321. This would be an eye sore and lower level buildings can provide the same accommodation as stated in the plan. This council is obsessed with building poor developments at the cost of its local people.

I am astounded how in these times, where so much emphasis is placed on the environment and how we can all better look after the open spaces, clean air and our own mental health benefiting from walks in the countryside. Which I and my family do. That this butchering of the English countryside, should even be contemplated. In lockdown, Enfield's space was used by people from all over the borough and beyond.

Enfield's allure is that it is so green and on the edges of London. A haven for all of us and wildlife. Where will all the wildlife go? This is a shocking scenario. To cut down historic trees to make way for housing that, if proper effort was made, can be made available across the borough.

Once, Enfield has been carved up and destroyed. It will never be the same, and what is lost can never be re planted. Whatever this council says.

I object strongly to all proposals.
