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I have resided in Enfield all my life, for the past 56 years at my present address.

I wish to show my concern at the following proposed developments in the Borough as follows:-

Policy SP PL10 Pages 80-87 Figure: 3.11 The possible housing development on either side of Enfield Road. At the present time this allows a green space between many housing estates. There is also access for walkers to use and provides a much needed space. If this was to be built up it would be a continuous housing estate from Enfield Town to Oakwood Tube Station. This area is also historically part of the old 'Enfield Chase' The former hunting ground of Kings and as such has value if not in a monetary sense certainly in an aesthetic sense.

Policy SP PL 9 Pages 77-80 Concept Plan Figure 3-10 3,000 new houses in a 'sustainable settlement' at Crews Hill with the potential for longer term expansion. I would question that an area such as this would be suitable for any large housing scheme. there is presently the Crews Hill Golf Club nearby which provides recreational time for the people of Enfield and since the closure of Whitewebbs G.C. has proved to be very popular. If this Club was to be threatened with closure it would deny many people the chance to experience the beauty of the local area. It does have a 'right of way' which is of course open to all. I would assume that this development would include 'affordable housing' , but thinking of its location I would think that the distance from local amenities could prove a problem for those living in this area.

Policy SA62 Page 383 & SP CL4 Pages 277-279 A big expansion of the Spurs Football training ground. I agree that the development presently owned by Spurs is well run and maintained but dispute that they need even more land. What assurances have been requested by the Council that if, later on Spurs find that they do not need all the proposed land it would not be sold off for more housing developments?

Policy DE6 Pages 156-160 and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre Page 321

The encouragement for tall buildings in this historic part of Enfield Town would totally overshadow the Town Centre Conservation Area.  
Enfield Town is an historic location and as such adds interest to this area.

In closing I would like to say that I do appreciate the need for good housing within our Borough but as this Pandemic has shown many people have benefited from access to the green spaces in our Borough and I fear that once gone, with

the best will in the world these areas will be gone forever.

I would also like to reference the Meridian Water development and ask why this plan has taken so long to be completed. It was supposed to be the answer to the housing problems of Enfield but very little has been published regarding the present situation.

It seems that plans to build on various Station Car Parks will also exacerbate parking problems in those areas. As I understand there are also plans to build on the sites of local supermarkets. Where are "ordinary people" expected to shop!
