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1. I object to following Policies: SP PL10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11; Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10; Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364; Policy SA54, page 374; and Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 – Because I'm against the use of Green Belt for housing and any other uses that render this extremely precious and necessary local amenity unusable to the public.

The loss of this unparalleled environmental resource will cause irreversible harm both to the unique features and attributes that make Enfield a desirable place to live and work and also to the Green Belt. Enfield Chase is part of Enfield's history and these sites are particular in this geographic location.

2. I also object to Policies SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 because they transfer part of Whitewebbs Park, a public amenity, into private management. I reject the Council's analysis that Whitewebbs Golf Course was losing money and call for its reinstatement.

This is a public amenity provided for the benefit of the public as a whole and is of huge benefit to the physical and mental health and well being of our residents and visitors. Therefore the disposal of it to private management for their exclusive use is against this principal

It's an area of biodiversity providing hydrology, shading and improved air quality. The loss to the people of Enfield and to the environment if these plans go ahead will be immense for the future.

3. I am also objecting to Policy SA52 page 372, which would remove part of Rammey Marsh, a public amenity and area for wildlife, from the Green Belt again this will destroy an area that deserves to be protected for the benefit of the people, the wildlife, and the environment.

4. I am also objecting to the tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321

Because the height of the buildings are unsightly and will spoil the character of the town and blot the local landscape in a beautiful conservation area.
