Objection to SA32, Sainsburys Green Lanes N21 3RS. Page 351 of Enfield Local Plan. Redevelopment of supermarket and car park to mixed-use homes and non-residential floor space.

I wish to object to the above proposal on the following grounds:

- Losing a major supermarket will mean that people will have to drive further increasing car usage and causing carbon monoxide levels to rise even further. It would especially affect the disabled and elderly residents and those who don't own cars.
- There would also be the added burden on schools, doctors surgeries etc. It's hard enough to a) get the children in the area into the local schools and b) to get a doctor's appointment. Increasing the population will only make things much worse..
- Combined with the development of Capitol House and the proposed Travis Perkins site, the disruption to existing residents would be tremendous. Green Lanes is already suffering with congestion due to the cycle lanes and the LTNs and this will only become worse, especially in peak times.
- Losing the small amount of the woodland walk behind Sainsburys would also impact on the wildlife and would be another example of a green space being eroded.

Enfield used to be a lovely place to live in, but I can understand why people are looking to move out of the area.

I hope that this development does not go ahead.
