Enfield Council needs to find a site elsewhere as there is already a burial site next to Firs Farm Wetlands. By proposing a new plan, Enfield council would take away fun and playgrounds from kids, our walking / jogging / sports and outdoor natural space. We go to Firm Farm wetlands almost everyday with kids and also with friends and family members. Such greenery and fresh air definitely rejuvenates all of us. By developing on this site, the council is going to add more frustration among the residents. Your development plan will destroy little left wild-life habitat and destroy woodlands.

Enfield council needs to find a site for their project elsewhere or even out of London where there are plenty of such green lands.
