

Being a resident of the Enfield Council, on The Larches, I and my family strongly oppose the plan to knock-down and rebuild the Sainsbury's super market site on Green Lanes for 299 houses and 140,000 sqft of commercial space.

The proposal by council will displace thousands of us to drive elsewhere and use more fuel and in turn add more CO2 in the atmosphere as there are no other supermarkets near-by.
