

Objection to SA32, Sainsburys Green Lanes N21 3RS. Page 351 of Enfield Local Plan. Redevelopment of supermarket and car park to mixed-use homes and non-residential floor space.

I have lived in the borough of Enfield for 57 years, firstly in Edmonton for 16 years, which over the years has been ruined by development and now so built up with very little green space. This council seems hell bent on doing the same to Winchmore Hill. It is a relatively small community which has now seen so much expansion ie the development of the old Capitol House, such a high building not in character with the area and the current development on the Travis Perkins site. If the Sainsburys site is

also developed Winchmore Hill as we have known it being village like, will be lost forever, it will completely destroy the uniqueness of the area. New buildings on the Sainsburys site will overshadow the beautiful architecture of the houses in the vicinity; the greenery around the present Sainsburys site as I remember was a compromise when we lost the playing fields to the supermarket.
