I have read your proposed plans and find that they have been produced in a way that is largely impenetrable, confusing and contradictory. I also wonder if they have been produced by anyone who actually lives in or cares about the Borough.

I am a Crews Hill Resident and have the following concerns and objections:

- Local people come here because they appreciate the Green Belt environment. At a time when there are serious concerns about our planet, the last thing you should be doing is destroying our Green Belt. Your role should be to protect it.
- As a Labour Council (albeit with a number of your own party's Councillors resigning because of their concerns at the way things are being run), why are you not supporting the Labour Mayor of London in his fight to protect the Green Belt?
- Crews Hill has no infrastructure to support 3500 new homes. What are your plans for schools, doctors surgeries etc.
- The station is poorly served with infrequent trains, has a lot of stairs and inaccessible to those with mobility issues. It also has very limited parking spaces
- The road system is already very clogged up with lorries etc. and has little or no capacity for more domestic traffic. We also experience frequent traffic jams when there are issues on the A10 or M25
- If you were to go ahead with your plans, how would the roads/area cope with the additional construction traffic?
- The idea that Crews Hill will become a cycle zone is ridiculous. It is called Hill for a reason as there are hills in every direction. I own a bike and it's hard work and the roads are narrow and dangerous
- Crews Hill has a number of long-established businesses which people come to from throughout the South East. They provide employment and have local history and should not be replaced with houses
- There are a number of brownfield sites that could equally fulfil your housing needs without ruining our Green Belt
- How will you be able to guarantee that the houses go to Enfield residents? My own children who were born in Chase Farm have been priced out of the area.
- Isn't the Council the main beneficiary of these plans? I pay more in Council Tax in Crews Hill for a 2 bedroom property than I did for a 5 Bedroom in Winchmore Hill/Grange Park

I and my family urge you to think again and perhaps consult with your residents. I'm unaware that any real consultation has taken place. I would also be interested to know how many of your senior officers and those offering advice live in the Borough.
