I have recently been made aware of proposals to develop the Green Belt in the London Borough of Enfield. I believe that the green belt should be protected and building on brownfield land should be prioritised instead. I strongly object to these plans that have been stealthily brought forward by the council. I hope that something can be done to put a stop to this as I believe it will have a disastrous affect on our area. It seems this council is on mission to concrete over our beautiful Enfield.

The plans to develop go against the London Majors London Plan 2021 which state that the Major strongly supports the continued protection of London's Green Belt and recognises the importance of the capitals Green Belt which makes up 22 per cent of London's land area.

The specific areas of the Draft Local Plan I strongly object to are: SP PL10, pages 80-87, and Figure 3.11; Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10; Policy SA45: Land Between Camlet Way and Crescent Way, Hadley Wood, page 364; Policy SA54, page 374; and Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279 – all of which propose the designation of Green Belt for housing and other purposes.

I also object to Policy SA62 page 383 and SP CL4 pages 277-279, and tall building policies on pages 156-160, Figure 7.3, Figure 7.4 and Policy DE6, and SA2 Palace Gardens Shopping Centre page 321. This is abhorrent.

The Vicarage Farm site in particular was purchased by a know property developer some 15 years ago. Who appears to have held onto the site awaiting their chance, with minimal effort to revitalise the farm land. These plans pay no regard to the existing residents bordering the farm. With development going right up to their properties borders This seems grossly unfair.

I take note that I have received no official information from the council about these plans that will drastically affect our local area for good. Without the local resident groups I would be unaware. This is scandalous. This seems to go along with council policy recently displayed by the sudden closure of Whitewebbs golf club with no warning.
