I was dismayed to read the plan to redevelop the Sainsbury's site. I use this supermarket and it's the main one for the area. I was surprised that even with the proposed development including 299 houses there is no mention of essential supporting infrastructure. I am worried about the impact on the local community and green lanes in particular. The increased traffic and loss of car parking spaces. That part of winch more hill lost parking with the cycle lanes and local businesses suffered. Not everyone can cycle and the car is needed when doing bigger shops. My mother is a blue badge holder and I am her main carer. We use the supermarket and small shops in winch more hill. I am also worried about the loss of green space. I recall when Sainsbury's was built planning permission was given on condition of keeping the remaining green space as some was lost for the building of the supermarket. We need the trees and space for wildlife. It benefits the whole community.

This part of Enfield has some properties of historical value. How will this development fit in? How does it fit in with other planned development e.g. former police station d travis Perkins site. I am concerned about retaining the character of the area. i feel it's excessive given the lack of in fracture such as health, education and transport services.
