

## Object to Enfield Local Plan proposal

I have asked for a meaningful summary to give a precis of the 413 page written document plus plan drawings that Enfield Council have asked residents to read, consider and comment upon. However your Local Plan Team just pointed me to the summary leaflet which to be quite frank tells residents very little and feels like it is playing down key issues like Enfield Council's plan to build upon Green Belt land. This "summary" document is very lacking of the actual key points of what is being proposed that you would normally expect to find in a summary document, and therefore I find Enfield Council's summary not fit to be used to consult residence on such an important decision.

The Green Belt is here for a reason. So many Enfield residents enjoyed and indeed needed the local green spaces to help both our physical and mental health during the recent covid lockdowns. I found on a number of occasions during the lockdown that the existing green spaces were very well used to the point that sometimes I avoided using them at certain times just so that I could keep a safe distance from others and reduce the risk of contracting covid 19 myself. To reduce the amount of existing green space seems criminal and is also another nail in the environments coffin - I thought that our Environment would be a priority for Enfield Council to protect!
