**Objection to SA32, Sainsburys Green Lanes N213RS  
Page 351 of Enfield Local Plan**

We would like to strongly object to the proposed redevelopment of this planned site for the redevelopment of supermarket and car park to mixed-use homes and non residential floor space.

There has been no consideration to the impact this will have on the environment , local infrastructure and traffic, which is already a nightmare due the incompetence of this council's decisions.

Our objections are :-

- With no planning for infrastructure how will the already stretched provision in Health and Education meet demand. Is this of no importance to Enfield council ?
- We have an already appalling traffic situation and this plan will further exasperate the congestion and pollution problems in the area, with increases in carbon monoxide. This will in turn damage the health of those children in Highfields and Winchmore and other surrounding schools. Is this of no importance to Enfield council ?
- This Sainsbury's supermarket provides a crucial retail outlet to many residents who depend and rely on it . Including the Elderly, those with disabilities and those who don't have cars or choose not to drive in order to protect our environment now and for the future . Is non of this of importance to Enfield council?
- The wooded area provides habitat for rare species and protected trees. The space is used by families, elderly people, residents from the nearby flats and care home. It is a small green area where people can meet, walk, play and contributes massively to their health and well being. Is this of no importance to Enfield council ?
- What housing is being Planned ? Will the housing be affordable? Will it provide provision for young struggling families? Will it include adapted housing provision for those with disabilities and learning needs? This space is not big enough and does not have the infrastructure to offer this . Are non of these issues important to Enfield council?

I would like to add that I have been a Labour voter my entire life and along with many friends who live in Enfield, have been appalled by the decisions and actions of this council. I look forward to the day when I can vote and have the council replaced by people who care about this borough and those who live in it.
