

MY OBJECTIONS TO ENFIELD COUNCIL'S DEVELOPMENT PLANS

I strongly object to most of the elements of the Enfield Council's planned developments described in the Draft Regulation 18 Enfield Local Plans: 2019-2039.

My objections are being placed on record (via email) on 10th September 2021, and therefore satisfy a requirement to submit objections before 23.59 13th September 2021

The reasons for my objection are:

- the proposed developments will remove large areas of green space at a time when it is most urgently required to reduce the effects of global warming on the environment. The plans run counter to the advice and guarantees given by the Mayor of London to protect the "green belt" around London.
- the proposed growth in housing and accommodation will result in large numbers of extra residents in areas of the borough that are already densely populated, leading to an increasing strain on services such as schooling, health and medical facilities, shopping, legitimate places to park vehicles, council services, etc.
- the proposed replacement of local supermarkets and adjacent car parks with new residential properties. As an elderly couple (my wife is 82 and I am 91), we rely like many similarly elderly neighbours, on the convenience of having a food and goods shop nearby.
