I am objecting to the proposed building of houses behind the large Sainsbury's supermarket in Green Lanes. This proposed development will increase traffic levels and pollution to surrounding streets and local school. Not to mention the disruption caused by any building work. It will destroy habitat and mature trees where I personally have heard and seen a woodpecker, robins, blackbirds, butterflies etc. Also I understand that some of the trees have protection orders (poplars and oak trees).

In 1986 the Secretary of State allowed planning permission for Sainsbury's to be built there with the condition the green space would be retained for community use. People who live in flats nearby who have no garden of their own can use it.

The development needs to be in keeping with the existing housing. It will contribute to over development of the area, the former Travis Perkins yard is close by.
