I have already commented on the proposal to consider part of Firs Farm recreation area as a site for a new crematorium but have since further browsed the local plan and have some additional comments.

Primarily, further reading of the overall plan and the council's strategic view for Enfield reinforces my opinion that Firs Farm would be a totally unsuitable site for a crematorium as it would be in direct contravention to the stated aim of maximising and increasing publicly accessible open space and outdoor sports facilities. It would also severely compromise the vision of a 'world class sports village' at Firs Farm.

The area adjacent to the A10 is greatly lacking in accessible open space and it is not appropriate to further reduce this in any way. I would therefore suggest that Firs Farm should not be considered as a potential site for a crematorium and all references to this be removed from the plan

Secondly, I note that several of the designated sites for large housing developments are local supermarkets serving local residential communities e.g. Asda and M&S at Southgate, Sainsbury at Winchmore Hill, Tesco at Southbury Road.

If these supermarkets are lost then this will only increase the road traffic in the borough as local people will not be able to carry out their day to day shopping on foot. I would also suggest that it would lead to a significant shortage of food shops in parts of the borough.

This does not seem to be a viable proposal.
