

Objection to SA32, Sainsburys Green Lanes N21 3RS. Page 351 of Enfield Local Plan. Redevelopment of supermarket and car park to mixed-use homes and non-residential floor space.

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I object to the above for the following reasons:

#### Local Facilities

The loss of a major supermarket in the area will force people to have to drive, causing more rather than less traffic on Enfield Roads. The elderly will have to go much further and locals on a limited budget will have to pay more if they have to shop in small convenience shops.

There is not any proper infrastructure planned for Doctors, Dentists, Schools, Parking, Vets. Local residents are waiting up to 10 days for a phone appointment at our local doctors and the Local Hospitals are at breaking point. Both primary and secondary schools in the area are oversubscribed and provision for special needs is poor, with ASD pupils already having to travel to Woodford and Haringey.

Local shops will suffer further as there will be less parking with both Sainsbury's and the Fords Grove Car Park going.

People driving to shops will increase road usage and carbon monoxide levels will climb even further than the already unacceptable levels Global Warming Given the problems highlighted by extreme weather this summer, this development will lead to the destruction of habitat and woodlands – the site is home to at least three different species of woodpecker (greater/lesser spotted and green varieties) as well as trees with protection orders (poplars and oak trees). Sainsbury's Green space provides hundreds of trees which are cleaning our air and providing a safe open space for those who live in flats in the area.

This is an inappropriate choice of site for such a development which would not be in keeping with the area and would cause overdevelopment and disruption along the main Green Lane artery road.
