Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this important consultation.

We are writing to object to draft policy DM BG10 in the Draft Enfield Local Plan. This allocates Firs Farm Wetlands (Site ID SA59) as a site for burial and/or crematorium use.

Firs Farm Wetlands is a Nature Conservation, the biodiversity; wildlife and plants, are at risk if this proposal goes ahead.

Firs Farm Wetlands is a healthy ecosystem and rich biodiversity, providing tremendous benefit to both humans and wildlife.

There is growing scientific evidence which demonstrates how being in green open spaces greatly improves both mental and physical health and wellbeing.

There needs to be a greater focus on the living; supporting individuals to improve their mental, emotional and physical health and wellbeing.

Firs Farm Wetlands already does this, it provides a haven for so many, a place of beauty, serenity and peace, a place where individuals can connect with other people, a place where individuals can reconnect with nature.

We call on the Council to cancel all considerations to make any changes to Firs Farm Wetlands, to refrain from carving up this beautiful conservation as a site for burial and/or crematorium use.

We call on the Council to please continue to support Firs Farm Wetlands and all who benefit from this sacred space.
