I would like to lodge an objection to the redevelopment of the supermarket and car park to mixed-use homes and non-residential floor space.

Like so many recent council redevelopments, e.g. the bicycle lanes introduced into Green Lanes which have made car travel so difficult followed by the ridiculous LTNs which then forced further traffic onto these roads that have already been made congested by the introduction of bicycle lanes - this is a change that makes the area less desirable, removes some more of what is left of the community spirit within the area and makes supermarket shopping more more difficult as it will cause people to have to travel further to shop (thereby further conflicting with the council target of reducing pollution by the use of the LTN).
