I object to the development of the supermarket site on the following grounds:

- there are no other full size supermarkets in the area. It will increase the number of cars and distance driven as the already congested road to Morrison's via Green Lanes is under pressure from the LTN and to Southgate Asda for the same reason. The Waitrose in N21 already has car congestion on Vicars Moor Lane (where I live) on the weekend and this would be much worse if Sainsbury's disappeared

- the balance of the housing and commercial property would be lost. We need shops as well as houses and the pressures on schools and GPs would be unsupportable.

- the surrounding gardens at Sainsbury's are so valuable for people living in flats nearby. I previously lived in a flat on Hoppers Road and used these gardens every day. Especially for elderly people who can't walk as far as Grovelands Park, it would be a tremendous loss.

- environmental considerations. The increase in driving this would cause is directly opposed to the strategy the council say they are following regarding the cycle lanes and LTN. The inconsistency makes no sense whatsoever.

You will drive families out of the area and make a transient community which will be hard to go back on. Already families want to leave London and this will hasten the speed of change.
