I note that the DLP proposes to construct housing within various areas of Green Belt land, including within 'Chase Park' (Policy SP PL 10), Crews Hill (Policy SP PL9), Hadley Wood (SA45), Rammey Marsh (SA52). I hereby strongly object to any and all such construction within Green Belt land for the following reasons:

- 1. Green Belt land is extremely precious and must be preserved for the people of this country and of Enfield. In particular:
- 1a. It provides vital well-being benefits, through bringing people close to nature and as a release from the pressures of life, which are magnified in the fast-paced conurbation of London. It also provides opportunities for people to exercise, again generating health benefits.
- 1b. It provides beauty and a wonderful contrast to the urban jungle.
- 1c. It provides many environmental benefits, which urbanisation cannot provide, including important habitat for a diverse range of species.
- 1d. The specific areas of Green Belt affected by the DLP are within the historically important Enfield Chase; this piece of countryside along with its history is unique and must be treasured and preserved.
- 2. There are many existing 'brown field' areas within the borough of Enfield, which are unattractive, unproductive and depressing and should be utilised for new house construction in preference to Green Belt land.
