

The population of the area would be too great. Too many apartments – given the recent and future developments along Green Lanes - Travis Perkins, Capitol House, Winchmore Hill Police Station as was.

The plan has no supporting community infrastructure leading to overstretch of facilities eg - doctors surgeries, dentists, schools etc.

Congested roads and pressure on parking.

Loss of green space – an area for families and leisure which contributes to the health and wellbeing of all residents as well as mitigation against pollution, will increase carbon monoxide levels for all.

Totally changing the character of the area Inappropriate choice of site given the close proximity of existing traditional historical properties.

Loss of the major supermarket in the area, forcing people to have to drive further. This would affect elderly and disabled residents in particular and increase car usage.

In 1986 Planning permission for Sainsburys to be built was allowed by the Secretary of State on condition the green space was retained.

Development would destroy habitat and woodlands, trees with Protection Orders and three different species of wood pecker.
