<u>Local Plan - Site SA45 – Land between Camlet Way and Crescent West, Hadley Wood</u>

I have lived in Hadley Wood since 1979 and regularly walk along the fields off Bartrams Lane overlooking this land. This site forms part of a stunning landscape which goes well beyond the borough boundary. My wife is now wheelchair bound and I take in her wheelchair regularly along Batrams Lane and we enjoy immensely the stunning landscape views. I am very saddened by the prospect of losing this valuable green belt asset for development.
