I wish to strongly object to the possible development of the Sainsbury's supermarket site for housing in Winchmore Hill. Please see my reasons below:

- * This is already an over populated area that can ill afford a development of this type and scale. There have already been large developments (Capital House) and planned developments on the Travis Perkins site. These are all in close proximity to one another.
- * There is no supporting infrastructure to support this proposed development, doctors, dentists, public transport and local schools are already over subscribed.
- * Congestion on the roads in the area will increase to dangerous levels both in terms of pollution and road safety not mention pressure on parking. Traffic in Winchmore Hill is at an all time high due to such schemes as LTN and cycle lanes.

- * It is a inappropriate site given the proximity to existing traditional historical properties.
- * There would also be a potential for claims for reduction in property values, this money would be better spent on housing in a more appropriate location.
- * The loss of Sainsbury supermarket would have a major affect on Winchmore Hill, it is the biggest employer in the area, a large portion of the work force are working parents and the young who are in further education, both will struggle to find job that work around there lifestyles and needs.
- * Sainsbury's serves the people of Winchmore hill and the surrounding areas, these will be force to travel in their cars further afield causing more pollution.
