I am writing to object to the dedesignation of green belt areas within Enfield. Green belt is an irreplaceable benefit to the environment, air quality, fauna & flora and people of north London - both now and in the future. Its well-reasoned introduction in the past, has prevented the un- ending sprawl of conurbation that has reduced the quality of life, damaged the environment and access to countryside for those living in the large conurbations of many parts of Britain. I believe alternative approaches to housing provision are available, even within Enfield and Greater London, though they be less attractive to commercial developers or require redevelopment of existing non-greenfield sites.

I also object to the removal of green spaces public access and change of use that removes utility for existing Enfield residents - such as parks, recreation spaces and centres of specialised trade such as Crews Hill or other local commercial retail facilities.
