Subject: Comments on Incorrect Information in the Proposed Local Plan

Dear Sir/Madame,

I write on behalf of the trustees of the Sisters of he Holy Family of Nazareth-Good Shepherd Province, registered charity 234201. We are land owners located at

Holy Family Convent 52 London Road, Enfield, Middlesex EN2 6EN

There has been no direct contact with us concerning the proposed land plan. Perhaps this is the reason the plan incorrectly describes ownership of property on page 320 and other pages of the plan that refer to the St Anne's school property.

St Anne's School stands on land owned by the Roman Catholic diocese of Westminster. The land includes the space occupied by the school buildings and the tennis courts. Our trustees originally owned the school and the tennis courts and transferred the ownership of such to the Roman Catholic diocese of Westminster.

Our trustees currently own the field and the convent property at 52 London Road. See the attached Land Registry Map. The field was never in the ownership of the Catholic diocese of Westminster although the field was used by St Anne's school for activities as a gracious gesture of our trustees. Currently a licence exists between our trustees and the Roman Catholic diocese of Westminster allowing St Anne's to use the field for specific hours for a specified period of time. The field remains in the private ownership of the trustees of our charity.

The size of the various ownerships is shown in an attachment to this email. The school land and the tennis court is 1.95 acres. the field is 2.22 acres (1.55 + 0.67 acres) and the convent site is 0.83 acres.

The inaccuracies in the proposed local plan concerning our charity's property have generated comments which may be inappropriate due the misunderstanding of the ownership of the land. Also the number of projected houses on each of the sites requires new consideration.

In the future we would anticipate consultation with the Enfield Council when reference is made to properties owned by our trustees.
