I wish to strongly object to the published "Draft Local Plan" for the following reasons:

- 1. The whole purpose of the Green Belt was to protect against uncontrolled development. The Council's plan will extinguish a large swathe of this protected land
- 2. The world is faced with horrific global warming, which at last is being properly understood. Replacing a large area of "green land", which is part of the lungs of North London, with concrete goes completely against current beliefs, including those of the Governments
- 3. The Council talks of affordable housing for local inhabitants. From past records that is not what the developers will build. Apart from a small percentage of affordable housing, the majority will be high cost housing
- 4. Currently local residents have access to parts of this land for recreational purposes. We are faced with a population that is becoming increasingly obese. It is foolhardy to remove the facility for exercise to be taken
- 5. Today it is reported that a large number of M.P.s will today lay a Presentation Bill in the House of Commons to encourage Robert Jenrick the Housing Secretary to incorporate in his proposals provisions that would enable local communities to VOTE on housing style and density in their area. It is clear that there is growing concern over the rapid expansion of development , and Enfield Council are obligated to take serious notice of this as our elected representatives .
- 6. These proposals will result in the loss of acres and acres of wild life habitat. Your disregard for the eco structure of the area will have a grave affect for us all
- 7. You state you have built on brown field sites , but there is much more you can do in this
- 8. The road access to three of the proposed areas, namely Enfield Road Hadley Road and Cattlegate Road cannot cope with enormous increase in traffic which will arise
- 9. There is a current shortage of infrastructure facilities e.g. doctors schools hospitals, development of this magnitude will have a devastating affect in these areas. There is currently a nationwide shortage of doctors and nurses, so even if you built another hospital for instance, how would you staff it?

I look forward to hearing these current proposals will be scrapped
