all of which propose the redesign of of Green Belt for housing and other purposes.

The loss of these sites would have a significant impact to the people and nature of the area. The areas proposed provide a natural for recreational outdoor space which has become even more relevant given the circumstances of the last 18months where the public health impact of COVID-19 has caused us to reevaluate our lifestyles, health, societal and environmental factors. Reducing green space has a directly negative impact of harm on our wildlife and biodiversity and will quickly increase the very measures of environmental damage that London is desperately seeking to reduce through its targets and commitments to sustainable reduction of our carbon footprints.
