I am against many aspects of the local plan.

I do not want to see more high rise dwelling. Look at the trouble that arises in the ones we have already. The council has already pulled down some of the blocks built in the 60s, so why build more? The plan glosses over the fact that it has already given permission to build high rise buildings on the site of B and Q, despite the fact that they will completely dwarf everything around them.

I do not support building on the green belt and on green fields. On one hand the plan babbles about the greening of Enfield and on the other it talks of building over swathes of open land. This shows how duplicitous the plan is.

If the Council really wanted to produce some housing, why has it so miserably failed at Meridian Water. How long has that saga continued?

Why is the plan so anti the car? I walk, I use public transport and I drive (I like many people cannot ride a bike - sorry). There is a place for each. I use my car to shop as I cannot carry shopping home. I go to my local Tesco at Savoy Pde, Morrisons, Southbury Road, Tesco, Ponders End and Sainsbury's, Crown Road, because there is surface level parking. If these are destroyed and multistorey parking introduced, I will be shopping at Brookfield in Cheshunt. You, the council, have already taken away the only surface car park in Enfield Town, to build some ugly office block for Metaswitch. Now that has changed hands, how long is that going to stay in Enfield?

Oddly enough despite promoting the building of this ugly office block, all the other offices in Enfield Town have been allowed to be turned in to flats, some so small I wouldn't house a dog in them, but you gave permission anyway.
